Number	Title	Resolution
1	Expanding Primary Voting Rights	DFL Supports allowing 17-year olds who will become 18 on or before general election day and who will be eligible to register to vote may register to vote in the primary election to the general election.
2	Full Voter Enfranchisement	DFL supports full voter enfranchisement, affirms that past criminal acts should have no bearing on voting eligibility in the future, and urges the continuation of voting rights to those with criminal records, thus allowing all eligible citizens under Minnesota's constitution access to participate in our democracy.
3	Rights to Gender Affirming Care	DFL supports amending the section on Civil, Human, and Constitutional Rights to include the following language: "the rights of trans, non-binary, and two-spirit individuals to access gender affirming care," "We Oppose" bullet 2 of the DFL Ongoing Platform would then read: Government interference in all matters related to the control of one's own body, including protections of the rights of women to bear children, practice birth control and obtain safe and legal abortions, <u>the rights of trans, non-binary, and two-spirit individuals to access gender affirming care</u> , and the rights of patients and their families, guardians, and physicians to honor a decision not to extend life by artificial means.
4	Pathway to Citizenship	DFL supports passing comprehensive immigration reform like that proposed by Senators Lankford, Murphy and Sinema in 2023, which includes a path to citizenship for undocumented residents who have been in the United States for longer than three years.
5	Immigrant Citizenship	DFL supports Federal legislation establishing a clear, earned pathway to citizenship while prioritizing keeping families together and safeguarding due process for undocumented immigrants who: have lived in the US for a substantial period, pass criminal background checks with no serious violent criminal record, register with Federal authorities and comply with program requirements, and are eligible for work authorization during the process.
6	Voter Protection and Senate Participation	DFL supports prioritizing voter access, voter confidence, and election protection in preparation for the 2026 elections by expanding voter education, providing clear communication about voting rights, coordinating election-protection efforts, and opposing voter intimidation and suppression.

7	Repeal Minnesota's Anti-Boycott Laws	DFL supports repealing the anti-boycott laws in Minnesota statutes 3.226 & 16c053 (both titled "Contracts with vendors who discriminate against Israel prohibited").
8	Combating Antisemitism and Islamophobia	DFL condemns antisemitism and Islamophobia in all forms, including the targeting of individuals, business, communities, and institutions; and is committed to dispelling anti-Jewish and anti-Islamic bias in all of its manifestations.
9	End-Of-Life Options (MAID)	DFL supports the End-Of-Life Options Act, which allows terminally ill, mentally capable adults access to medical aid in dying (MAID) to make decisions that are best for them and their families.
10	Amend Platform: End-of-Life Options	DFL supports amending the Ongoing Platform to support the End-Of-Life Act by including medical aid in dying (MAID)
11	Right to Privacy	DFL supports the right to privacy in all areas of life, including but not limited to personal healthcare decisions, digital communications and information, and freedom from unwarranted government surveillance.
12	Civil Lawsuits for Constitutional Violations	DFL supports legislation to establish a right for Minnesotans to sue local, state, or federal government for civil and/or monetary damages for constitutional violations.
13	Claw Back ICE Money	DFL supports clawing back \$170 billion provided to federal agencies for immigration enforcement in the so-called One Big Beautiful Bill Act.
14	End Family Detention	DFL demands an end to family detention.
15	End Local Cooperation with ICE	DFL supports halting 287(g) agreements, which allow ICE to collaborate with state/local/tribal law enforcement.
16	Repeal Federal Retaliation Acts	DFL supports repealing the Alien Enemies Act and prohibiting the use of the Insurrection Act by this administration.
17	Federal Immigration Enforcement Legislation	DFL demands Congress not pass any legislation that provides additional authority or discretion to the Department of Homeland Security or other federal agencies to engage in immigration enforcement actions.
18	The Abolition of ICE	We support complete and total abolition of the Immigrant and Customs Enforcement Agency, and the dismantling of the Department of Homeland Security.

19	ICE Out	DFL supports abolishing Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE); and restructure immigration enforcement in a way that protects and respects working, immigrant families regardless of status; and that a proper investigation into the deaths of Minnesota residents at the hands of ICE and Border Patrol are conducted by state and local law enforcement.
20	ICE out of Minnesota	DFL calls for the removal of ICE from Minnesota to protect the safety, dignity, well-being of all Minnesotans.
21	Law Limiting ICE Activities	DFL supports requiring MN federal legislators to secure legislation establishing that no federal funds be authorized, appropriated, or used in any way to carry out police activity by any person working for or at the direction of the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) Authorized ICE activities shall be limited exclusively to measures to secure removal of only those undocumented persons who have been convicted of a felony.
22	ICE Eviction Moratorium	DFL supports an eviction moratorium paired with emergency rental assistance related to federal agents' actions in Minnesota.
23	ICE Away from Our Kids	DFL supports ensuring any student or educator who misses school because of safety concerns around ICE not be penalized by their school, unenrolled from their school, nor face adverse court consequences for those absences, schools be supported to have the flexibility for remote or virtual learning, and creating sanctuary spaces in and around schools and daycares where ICE cannot operate.
24	Require Identification by Federal Officers	DFL supports lawful, constitutional, and non-violent immigration enforcement, and supports requiring all ICE and Border Patrol officers operating in Minnesota to clearly identify themselves before interacting with any member of the public, including showing their face and visible agency identification except in rare situations where there is a clear and immediate safety risk.
25	Accountability for ICE	DFL supports prohibiting federal immigration enforcement agents from concealing their identities, conducting warrantless arrests, and conducting immigration enforcement action at schools, daycares, churches, and healthcare clinics.
26	DFL Opposes Inhumane Immigration Enforcement	DFL opposes the inhumane policies and procedures of immigration enforcement which threaten entire immigrant communities and deprive them of basic human rights.

27	Ban Paramilitary Tactics	DFL demands a federal ban on masks, firearms, and chemical weapons in Civil Immigration enforcement and crowd control.
28	End Violent Federal Immigration Tactics	DFL continues to support legal, non-violent immigration enforcement that respects civil rights and due process, and condemns the use of excessive force, intimidation, or violent tactics by federal immigration enforcement agencies operating in Minnesota by way of policies that prioritize de-escalation, transparency, and accountability in all federal immigration enforcement actions.
29	Religious Inclusivity	In an effort to be more inclusive of people's religious observances, the DFL encourages each of its Organizing Units and Committees to consider religious observances in scheduling meetings. This includes, but is not limited to prayer breaks; and alternating conventions and/or weekend meetings between Saturdays and Sundays; and consideration of religious dietary needs.

30	Support 250:1 School Counselor Ratio	DFL supports a school counselor to student ratio of 250 to 1 as recommended by the American School Counselor Association.
31	Freedom to Learn	DFL supports a welcoming school environment for all students regardless of identity, and supports an honest, accurate, and culturally responsive curriculum.
32	Prohibition of Parental Opt-Out	DFL supports updating State Statute 120B.20 (Parental Curriculum Review) to prohibit parents and guardians from opting students out of curriculum based on the representation of protected classes (as defined by the Minnesota Human Rights Act).
33	Fund our Schools	DFL supports further investment in the state's public education system by closing the general formula funding gap, seeking funding mechanisms including increases to state revenue that address rising costs for transportation and school safety by taxing the ultra-wealthy and corporations, and opposing any cuts to special education funding.

34	Support High Quality Public Education	The DFL supports high quality public education that provides access and opportunity to all students from pre-K to community and four year post secondary institutions.
35	End School Voucher Programs	Voucher programs that divert public funds to private & religious schools shall be abolished as they divert critical funds from already under-resourced public schools.
36	Separation of Church and State	DFL affirms the importance of maintaining a clear separation between church & state by opposing the use of taxpayer dollars to subsidize religious institutions that are not held to the same civil rights & nondiscrimination standards as public schools.
37	School funding for eLearning	DFL supports one time funding for public school districts to make up costs associated with e-learning because of ICE/DHS Activity.

38	HERC Employee Support	DFL supports ensuring employees at the HERC (Hennepin Energy Recovery Center) are offered same or similar job options if HERC closes.
39	Shut Down HERC Trash Burner	DFL Party supports combating environmental racism by demanding the Hennepin County Board keep its promise and shut down the HERC trash burner by 2027 in line with a resolution passed by the City of Minneapolis on October 31, 2024.
40	Ban Single Use Plastics	DFL supports requiring Minnesota to take common-sense steps to phase out unnecessary single-use plastics and support reusable and sustainable alternatives to protect clean water and human health.
41	Regulation of AI Data Centers	DFL supports regulating the aggressive expansion of AI data centers and their growing demand on our energy grid so we are not subsidizing AI companies and can ensure expanded access to clean, cheap energy.
42	Minnesota Climate Superfund	DFL supports legislation that will recover the costs of extreme weather damages from the very large polluters whose greenhouse gas emissions have caused them.
43	100% Clean Energy	DFL supports transitioning to a 100% equitable, clean energy economy in a way that reduces racial, gender, & economic disparities, and that meets or exceeds 'net zero' emissions by 2050.

44	Age Limit President 75	DFL supports prohibiting those 75 & older from running for the office of President.
45	Age Limit Supreme Court 75	DFL supports requiring members of the Supreme Court retire at age 75.
46	Age Limit Congress 75	DFL supports prohibiting those 75 & older from running for Congress.
47	Age Limit Cabinet and Judges	DFL supports requiring Cabinet Officials and Federal Judges to retire at 75 years of age.
48	Alex Pretti Renée Good Act	DFL supports the abolition of qualified immunity for federal immigration agents.
49	Independent Redistricting Commissions	DFL supports creating well-designed independent redistricting commissions to make the line-drawing process more open to, and reflective of, citizens' voices, and ensure politicians are accountable and responsive to their constituents.
50	Limit Access to Safe Spaces	DFL supports prohibiting federal agents without a signed judicial warrant from entering private homes or being within 660 feet of schools, childcare centers, libraries, houses of worship, voting sites, healthcare facilities, government centers, food shelves, stores/vendors with food sales that comprise greater than 50% of total sales, and non-profit offices and their surrounding private property.
51	No Retribution	DFL affirms its belief that retribution must not have any place in federal or state government.
52	Abolish the electoral college	DFL supports the abolition of the electoral college.
53	Protect Elections from Federal Intimidation	DFL supports passage of a law forbidding the presence, involvement, or oversight of federal immigration enforcement agencies such as ICE or Border Patrol at or near polling places, early voting sites, ballot drop locations, or election-related activities in Minnesota at any time.
54	Ranked Choice Voting Local Options	DFL supports Ranked Choice Voting Local Option legislation, allowing all cities, counties, and school districts to adopt RCV, if they wish.

55	Limit Corporate Money in Elections	DFL supports amending state laws such that they do not grant corporations the power to expend anything of value, directly or indirectly, to influence elections, while continuing to have all powers necessary for business operations, charitable activity, advocacy, and lobbying.
56	Safeguards Against Candidate Corruption	DFL supports requiring its endorsed candidates be impartial with respect to their individual portfolio holdings and not hold individual stocks in a company subject to the outcomes of their policies.
57	Say No to Foreign Influence	DFL pledges to not endorse candidates who accept funds from foreign lobbying interests or PACs.

58	Affordable Healthcare for All	DFL supports affordable healthcare for all by expanding public healthcare programs, restricting profiteering in healthcare delivery systems, and increasing accessible care to elders and children by taxing the very rich to increase funding.
59	Minnesota Care for All	DFL supports expanding Minnesota Care eligibility to all Minnesota residents at a rate based on household income, and continuing the current tiered price system.
60	Lower Health Insurance Costs Now	DFL supports state and federal actions to lower health insurance premiums, deductibles, and out-of-pocket costs for individuals and families, and ensure access to affordable health care does not depend on a person's job, income level, or life circumstances.
61	Removing Private Insurers from Medicaid	DFL supports the Patient-Centered Care bill (Marty/Liebling) which would take away control of Minnesota's Medicaid program from private insurers and fully restore it to state control, with payment for care provided to those on Medicaid going directly to health care clinicians and hospitals.
62	Universal, Single Payer Health Care	DFL supports committing significant resources to promote universal single-payer health care legislation that puts patients over profits by enacting the Minnesota Health Plan at the state level and the Medicare for All Act (Jayapal/Sanders) at the national level.

63	Support Affordable Housing	DFL supports continued funding for Bring It Home rental assistance, expanded down payment & first generation homeownership opportunities, missing middle protection for income source, and overall support for affordable housing for rental & homeownership (especially extremely low income).
64	Improve Affordability for All Housing	DFL supports improving affordability for all housing by promoting actions that increase availability, provide funding for a continuum of care in supportive housing, and capping lot rent increases for manufactured homes.
65	Increase Amount of Affordable Housing in MN	DFL supports increasing the amount of affordable housing by supporting increased building across MN, pathways to home ownership, prohibiting source of income discrimination in rental housing, and statewide zoning reform.

70	32-Hour Week, Fair Overtime	DFL supports transitioning to a 32-hour standard workweek - where 32 hours is full-time - with no reduction in weekly pay or benefits, and supports strengthening overtime protections by requiring all employers to pay at least time-and-a-half for all hours worked over 40 hours in a seven-day period, without exemptions that exclude workers.

71	End Disabled Worker Subminimum Wage	DFL supports ending subminimum wages for disabled workers and ensuring disabled workers are paid at least the full minimum wage.
72	Protecting Inclusive Telework Arrangements	DFL supports protecting WFH arrangements through fair and transparent working conditions including bargaining protections, protection from retaliation and discrimination, job-related expense reimbursement, written telework policy requirements, and equity and privacy for remote workers.
73	Workplace Flexibility for State Employees	DFL supports urging Minnesota's governor to restore workplace flexibility for state employees and end the RTO (return to office) mandate.

76	No mobile data network interference	DFL opposes deployment of technologies which reduce the efficacy of personal communication devices, primarily mobile phone networks, without a judicial warrant and specified location/time.

78	BWCA monitoring during extraction	DFL supports requiring any material extraction (Mining, etc) be subject to monitoring at anytime or location deemed appropriate by state representatives (DNR, etc.). This surveillance will be daily to start and become gradually less frequent to monthly. Equipment to provide continuous monitoring will be implemented and data provided to the state on an ongoing/live schedule
79	BWCA Sulfide Ore Mining Ban	DFL supports a permanent ban on sulfide ore mining in the BWCA watershed
80	Stop the Mine outside BWCA	DFL supports passage of MN House and Senate bills HF 309/SF875 to prevent mining in the BWCA regardless of federal action.
81	Stand Up for Minnesota's Water	DFL supports clean water and policies that protect Minnesota's many waters from the dangers of copper-nickel sulfide mining, and protect Minnesota from foreign and domestic mining companies seeking to profit from exploiting our resources.

108	Help Older Minnesotans Live Independently	DFL supports legislation, policies, and programs that help Minnesota seniors live independently by increasing access to quality senior-living options, including in-home services; adequate funding for MN Aging Pathways (Senior Linkage Line) navigation assistance; and extending Age-Friendly Minnesota program
